1) Grant Committee: Polly Powell

- a) Polly provided an update on grant committee and introduced each awardee. Each grant recipient gave a summary of what the grant monies would be used for.
- b) 2022 Grants were awarded to:

 - iii) South Carolina Botanical Garden
- c) Carole Walters asked that the grant committee consider increasing the dollar amounts next year if the budget allows.

2) Newsletter: Laura Godfrey (Pam presented in Laura's absence)

- a) Oct. 1 deadline for next newsletter, which will go out on Oct. 15th
- b) It will be necessary to raise the price of mailed newsletters next year, probably in the \$25-\$30 per person range.

5) Bald Rock Heritage Preserve Cleanup Committee: Tony McDade

- a) New master plan with Clemson University landscape architecture
- b) The Bald Rock team in coordination with SCDNR is looking at how they change Bald Rock from being a destination for graffiti to being a destination for being outdoors with family and friends.
- c) Paul Russell, associate professor of landscape architecture at Clemson, is working with a team of landscape architects—including faculty members Matthew Nicoletti and Lara Browning as well as graduate student Annie Steele—to consult with SCDNR on the master plan.
- d) This agreement represents the first step toward creative and sustainable solutions for the many issues that challenge SCDNR's mission," said Susan Jordan, president of Friends of Bald Rock Heritage preserve. "We are confident that the study will offer designed solutions to deter vandalism, minimize maintenance, enable restoration of plant and animal habitats, enhance the safe public use of the property and protect and preserve the natural resources."
