3) Membership Report: Seth Harrison

- a) Reminder: dues go up from \$20 to \$25 after January 31.
- b) If dues are not paid by March 31, a person is no longer a UMNA member.

4) Treasurer's Report: Cindy Hekking

- a) Welcome to new members; anyone who paid dues at November Graduation meeting had paid dues through 2023.
- b) Pay Pal can be used to pay dues.
- c) 2022 Budget can be viewed on Google Drive.
- d) Beginning balance: \$13,008.34
- e) Ending balance: \$15,190.68
- f) Pam noted that more money has been spent for meeting places since earlier COVID precautions.

1) Bald Rock Heritage Preserve: Dave Redding

- a) Next workday at Bald Rock is February 16. Cleaning will include pressure washing. January workday was canceled due to inclement weather.

- a) UMNA Newsletter comes out every other month when there is no meeting.

Program:

Betsy Lewis introduced Matt Johnson, who works for the National Audubon Society as Director of the Audubon Center and Sanctuary at Francis Beidler Forest.

Matt spoke about the comprehensive and innovative work that is being done tracking bird migration, using banding data, genetic markers, and other data collection to specify what locations birds fly to and from. The SC Motus Tower

Network uses radio telemetry to track flight patterns. He also talked about upcoming projects and partnerships in South Carolina and what we can do to contribute information about bird migration: report what we see; participate in community science projects; and learn about conservation challenges.
