Committee Reports:

1. Volunteer Chair: Cindy Robinson

- a) This is the time of year to identify the Fig Buttercup and report location to the Clemson Extension Agency. After flowers bloom, it's difficult to identify roots. Put flag in location.
- b) YouTube video is available by googling Fig Buttercup.
- c) Bellfest took place last Saturday, March 11 at Devil's Fork State Park at Lake Jocassee. It was a cool, sunny, beautiful day with a huge attendance; 3 volunteer shifts instead of 2. Thanks to every volunteer and to those who attended.
