Officer Reports:

1. Secretary's Report: Emmy Holt

1. Bald Rock Project: Dave Redden

- a. Progress is being made on clean-up, but a new direction is being taken.
- b. Pressure-washing is eroding the rock surface; volunteers will start planting lichen on rock to begin growth and coverage of the rock.
- c. DNR is considering proposed changes to the BRHP. Access to Bald Rock may change; available parking may change from Highway 276, one-mile from start of the Bald Rock hike. Graffiti can be managed better this way. DNR owns the land and needs our support to change access and to clean out cars from below the cliff. The projects are costly and will take at least a year to complete.
